

Dear Parents \& Carers,


On Wednesday $29^{\text {th }}$ May 2024, The Most Reverend Bishop Michael celebrated his ten years of Episcopal Ministry in the Rockhampton Diocese. Bishop Michael was announced as the $10^{\text {th }}$ Bishop of Rockhampton, by Pope Francis on $10^{\text {th }}$ March 2014. The Mass at the Cathedral on Wednesday included the presence of the Apostolic Nuncio Archbishop Charles Balvo, who has been travelling around the Rockhampton diocese over the last week.

Bishop Michael and his Excellency, Archbishop Charles Balvo are visiting Mackay today. A special gathering will take place at St Patrick's hall this evening to celebrate Bishop Michael's $10^{\text {th }}$ anniversary as bishop of the Diocese of Rockhampton.

We congratulate Bishop Michael and thank him for his continuing spiritual guidance as shepherd of his diocesan flock.


TUTORING, EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, FAMILY HDLIDAY during school hours and term time disrupts a child's learning. Yes, I am once again on my soap box, as I struggle to understand why this is starting to appear at our school. Regular classroom learning provides a structured environment where students acquire essential knowledge, develop social skills and engage with their peers. Missing school days or even parts of days can disrupt this continuity and potentially hinder a child's progress.

Private extracurricular activities and tutoring serve specific purposes. While they can enhance a child's skills and confidence, they should ideally complement, not replace, regular schooling. Parents often seek private tutoring to address individual learning gaps or to provide additional support in specific subjects. All of these need to take place outside of school hours.

Family holidays during term time can indeed impact a child's education. These breaks disrupt the learning process and may require students to catch up missed lessons or to miss that component of learning all together.

What message do we send our children if we take them out of school for dance lessons, swimming lessons, tutoring, holidays etc? A very clear one in my opinion - primary education is not all that important.

Please ensure that your children are at school every day (unless sick of course) and arrive on time. I realise I have said this before, but I believe it bears repeating - children feel at their safest when routines are adhered to. Even 10 minutes late for school can be upsetting, particularly at the primary level.

## FREE ONLINE TUTORING FOR 6 MONTHS

## Students must be available $2-3$ times per week for 30 mins

The Griff Linc Reading Research team has developed a new tutoring method for middle years students struggling with reading. The tutors use artificial intelligence to write short texts specific to your child's interests and reading level, and use a six-step teaching method during each tutoring session. The researchers collect data on your child's reading assessments at the beginning and end of the project, as well as video recordings of the tutoring sessions. This data will be used to evaluate the impact of the project on middle years students struggling with reading.
